

Dan Fragiadakis, Assistant Professor of Economics, was a featured speaker at a Texas A&M University forum that focused on the research accomplishments of the 2017 Nobel Prize winners. Now in its second year, the event offers lectures by six TAMU professors on the nature and significance of the work of the new Nobel Laureates in the areas of medicine, physics, chemistry, literature, peace, and economics. The open forum was attended by the general public as well as by members of the A&M community.

Dr. Fragiadakis summarized the work of Richard Thaler, recipient of the 2017 Nobel Prize in Economics "for his contributions to behavioral economics." Dan's research specialization is in behavioral and experimental economics, so he was an ideal choice to provide perspective on Professor Thaler's body of research.

All six of the faculty presentations were interesting and informative. We, naturally, found Dan's lecture to be the best of show.
